Scolosis

If you look at someone's back, you'll see that the spine runs straight down the middle. When a person has scoliosis, their

backbone curves to the side. The angle of the curve may be small, large or somewhere in between. The most common type of scoliosis is idiopathic; it is present at birth and may be inherited. Other types include neuromuscular scoliosis and degenerative scoliosis. Idiopathic

scoliosis usually affects those ages 10-16, progressing during the growth years. Treatment varies and early intervention is important. The Saint Alphonsus Health Program routinely SCREENS all fifth and seventh graders. If a concern is identified, we will contact the parent and can make an appointment for the Scoliosis Evaluation Clinic which is hosted by Boise Schools and is a FREE evaluation by orthopedic specialists. (PA and Physicians). If you have questions, please call the school nurse.


